The Gilded border will cost 16/- extra for 18 inches charge only for the extra Silk.

I enclose samples of Silk. I think you will find them of very superior quality and colour.

The Portrait to paint it nicely will be rather an expensive job but this class of work must be a good business or the public soon condemn it.

I can have the Banner ready by the time you mention

if you give me the order at once. The mottoe you mention is of no importance as to cost.

We are very busy, having orders from Burnley, Bacup, Bolton, Bury, Rochdale, Ramsbottom, Colnefield, Nottingham, etc.

An early order is earnestly solicited

~~After a little conversation on the matter the vote was put to the meeting resulting in 7 votes against it in favour of J. Chaloner Preston.~~ Null

After which J Williamson resigned the Secretaryship of the Sheppard St Band of Hope for the following reasons.  
1st For unwise judgement on the part of the 7 who voted for J. Chaloner Banner.

2nd Because we had put to one side the Cheaper Banner by 2-4-0 on 43. and the Larger Banner by 6 inches.

3<sup>rd</sup> Because Samples of Silk could not be got from  
J Chaloner & the samples of Silk from J Bennett we  
never so much as examined showing plainly  
they had made up their minds to have the dearest  
Banner of the two

4<sup>th</sup> Because we had not money sufficient to spend  
in such a Banner if it had been cheaper.

5<sup>th</sup> Because my conscience would not let me sanction  
the throwing away of £2-4-0 or £3. when we had the  
estimate before us plainly showing <sup>which was cheapest.</sup> and acknowledged  
to be so even by some of those who voted for J. Chaloner  
The meeting then broke up.
